**Modified French Paper for Navan Schools.  
Junior Certificate French – Ordinary Level**

**Tuesday, 15<sup>th</sup> June 2005**

The State Examinations Commission has made a slight modification to the examination paper for candidates taking today's Junior Certificate Ordinary Level French examination in the four second level schools in Navan, Co. Meath. One of the questions on the original examination paper shows an image of a French greeting card and candidates were asked to indicate what sentiment the card was expressing. The picture on the greeting card was of school children on a school bus. The modified paper carried a different type of greeting card and question. The examination papers are the same in all other respects.

This year some 10,000 candidates are entered to sit today's Junior Certificate French examination at Ordinary Level. Almost 420 candidates are sitting the Junior Certificate in Navan. This examination commenced today at 9.30 AM today Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> May 2005.
